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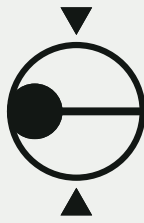

- **Taxis and Ride-Sharing:** Services like Grab are available in tourist areas. They're convenient but may not be accessible in more remote locations.
- **Public Buses:** While available, they are often crowded and lack air conditioning. They can be an economical option for budget travelers but may not be the most comfortable.

### Weather and Best Time to Visit

Bali has a tropical climate with year-round temperatures between 20°C and 32°C (68°F-90°F).

- **Dry Season:** May to October, with cooler temperatures and less rainfall.
- **Wet Season:** November to April, characterized by higher humidity and frequent rainfall.

The ideal time to visit is between May and August when conditions are warm and sunny. However, for fewer crowds, consider May, June, or September.





### **Currency and Payments**

The official currency is the Indonesian Rupiah (IDR). While credit cards are accepted in most establishments, it's advisable to carry cash, especially in rural areas and for small purchases.

### **Language**

Balinese and Indonesian are the main languages, but English is widely spoken in tourist areas. Learning a few basic Indonesian phrases can enhance your experience and show respect for the local culture.

### **Safety**

- Always wear a helmet when riding a motorbike.
- Be cautious of your belongings, especially in crowded areas, to avoid theft.
- Use Google Maps' "walking" route for better biking routes, but be aware that some alleys might be dead ends.
- Safe for solo travelers

### **Religion and Culture**

Balinese Hinduism is the predominant religion, influencing daily life and customs:

- Respect local traditions and dress modestly, especially when visiting temples.
- Be mindful of religious ceremonies and offerings (canang sari) placed on streets and in front of buildings.
- The concept of "Tri Hita Karana" emphasizes harmony between humans, nature, and the divine.

### **Sustainability and Nature Preservation**

Bali is making efforts towards environmental conservation:

- In 2019, the government banned single-use plastics.
- Coral reef restoration projects are ongoing in various coastal areas.
- Mangrove forest rehabilitation is taking place in areas like Ngurah Rai Grand Forest Park.

## NATURE

### **Tukad Cepung Waterfall**

Tumpek Krulut is a sacred day dedicated to music, art, and emotional connection honoring the deity Dewa Iswara. Traditional Gamelan orchestras and dancers perform special rituals and musical offerings in temples and village halls.
